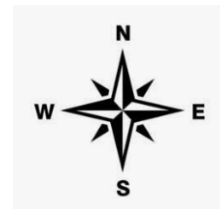
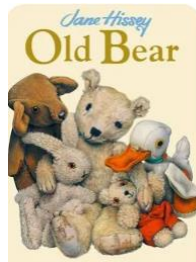
We are grateful to have the children back in our care, ready for exciting learning and new challenges. We hope everyone is safe, healthy and enjoyed spending quality time as families over the summer.

Science

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Reading

Reading is a great focus in Key Stage One learning. Every day, children will take part in a 45 minute phonics session. These sessions will focus on a sound progression as mapped out through our Ruth Miskin reading scheme

Every week, the children will receive to take home:

- A phonics book (pre-taught in school)
- A book bag book (a new book with links to the current teaching sounds)
- QR codes for clips of that week's focus sound

New books shall be provided every Thursday with the expectation they've been read by the Wednesday and reading logs signed by an adult.

Art

- To explore line and mark making to draw water.
- To draw with different media.
- To develop an understanding of mark making.
- To apply an understanding of drawing materials and mark making to draw from observation.
